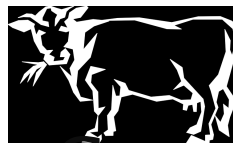

- 70% of the Earth's surface is covered by ocean
- 30% of the Earth's surface is covered by land
- Earth's weight - 5,972,000,000,000,000,000,000,000 lbs
- Earth's diameter - nearly 8,000 miles
- Highest point - Mt. Everest: 29,028 feet
- Lowest point - Dead Sea: 1,302 miles below sea level
- Earth travels through space at 66,700 miles per hour!
- Earth's rotation on its axis makes a day 24 hours
- Earth's orbit around the sun takes nearly 365 1/2 days (1 year)

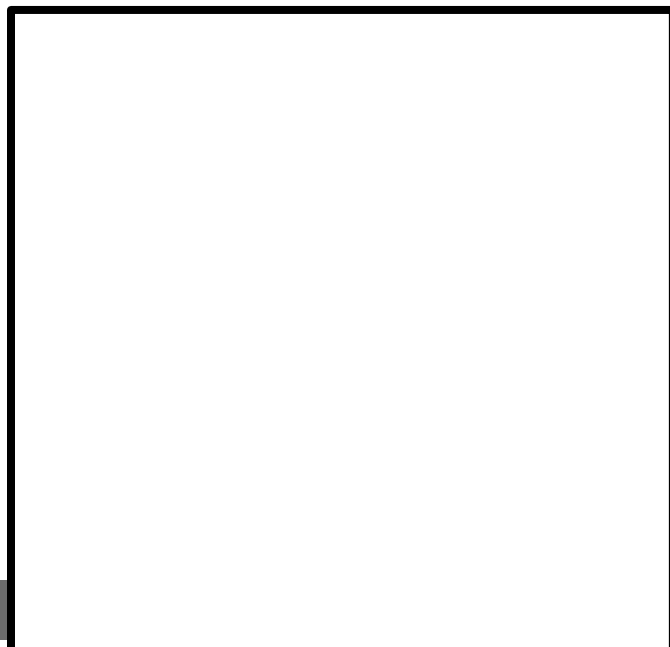
UPCOMING EVENTS...

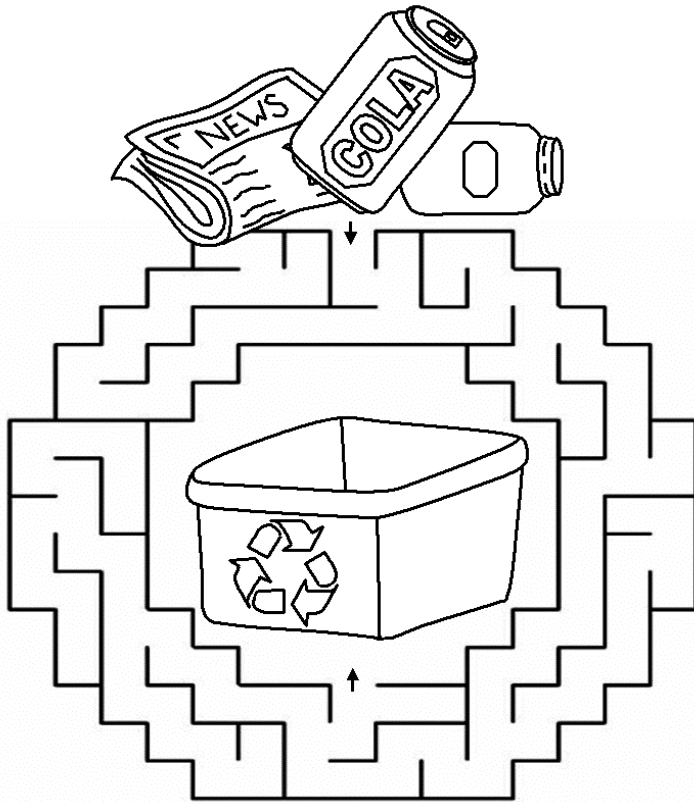
