Wyoming Land Trust and Teton Science School Sponsor Nature Camp in Sublette County, June 20–24

Pinedale, Wyoming – Nearly fifty Sublette County school children will spend next week tracing a pronghorn migration route, identifying local trees, exploring ponds and aquatic invasive species, learning about the history of the surrounding community and a host of other outdoor activities as part of the Wyoming Nature Camp.

"Wyoming Nature Camps provide an excellent opportunity to engage the next generation of Wyomingites in agriculture, wildlife, conservation, energy and other natural resources in the state," said Wyoming Land Trust Executive Director Lara Ryan. "It is exciting that our first nature camp this summer will be held right in the Wyoming Land Trust's backyard. We're looking forward to a great week for the Sublette County community."

The Wyoming Land Trust and Teton Science School have teamed up this summer to host four camps across the state which will give Wyoming children the opportunity to learn about the natural world. Approximately 150 youth from across the state are expected to participate, with 48 enrolled at the camp in Sublette County. Wyoming Nature Camps are open to all Wyoming children grades 1 through 6. A BBQ and award ceremony will be held Thursday, June 23 from 5:00 – 6:00 PM at the American Legion Park for campers and their families, local volunteers and sponsors.
